

# ADULT RECREATION

## Adult 17+ Coed Sand Volleyball League at Munson Park

- When:** Season begins June 2 and finishes once each team has played 12 games.
- Time:** 5:30, 6:15 or 7:00 pm, start times could vary based on # of teams
- Team Fee:** \$180.00 includes everything but refs
- Official Fee:** \$9 per team per game to be paid on the field – 1 official system
- May 15:** Deadline for all teams to submit team fees, team entry forms and completed roster with addresses/birth dates (signature page is due before first game starts)



## Frequently Asked Questions for Adult Sports

**How old do you need to be?** Most leagues are ages 17+

**How do we pay? Adult Softball and Volleyball** - Pay the team fee with the completed team entry form and completed roster at the Monroe Parks & Recreation Dept. (cash or check payable to Monroe Recreation Dept, Credit card-fees apply), through the mail, or use the City Payments Drop Box located on the south side of City Hall off of parking lot. **Adult Soccer** - registration fees are per player and can be paid through the above ways

State law requires that all players have a one-time (form remains on file in our office until child turns 18) concussion form on file each place they play a contact sport before they play. ## Park Rules and Regulations Refresher

From time to time, it is important to review some park rules to make sure all park users are safe and enjoy their visit. All City of Monroe park rules and regulations are posted in parks and are enforced under city ordinance no. 95-017. We are highlighting a few in this newsletter.

### Smoke Free Parks

We've all heard the negative effects of smoking; it compromises the immune system, increases respiratory infections, causes heart and lung damage, increases the risk for osteoporosis, increases the risk for cancer, and more. Even secondhand smoke can cause the same diseases in those who have never smoked.

Public Act 188 of 2009, Michigan's Smoke-Free Air Law established that all food establishments and all public places are now smoke free. This law was passed to "preserve and improve the health, comfort, and environment of the people of the state by limiting exposure to secondhand smoke."

In an effort to create healthier parks, especially for children, the City of Monroe Parks and Recreation Department has adopted a smoke free park policy. While this may take some time for all to be aware of, we will strive to educate all park users. For help to quit, please call 1-800-QUIT-NOW (1-800-784-8669). Let's work toward a healthier Monroe!

### All Dogs Must be on Leashes

In all City parks, dogs must be on a leash not over six (6) feet long and cannot run at large. While your dog may seem safe to you, dogs can be unpredictable. Not everyone is an animal lover, and some park users may even feel unsafe when dogs are running off leash. Owners of domestic animals shall be held responsible for the presence of their animal in any of the City parks and playgrounds. While it may seem tempting, parks are not off leash areas. Please leash your dog at all times!

## Community Garden Plot Rentals

### Don't have a space for a garden but love fresh fruits and vegetables? Think about renting a garden plot at Munson Park!

Growing your own food is an attractive alternative to the high prices of grocery shopping, and it also gives you a sense of pride watching your garden produce healthy choices for your family and getting exercise at the same time! Tilling and general maintenance of the plot is up to each renter. Water is available at the site, but gardeners need to supply their own hoses, tools, plants, soil amendments and fertilizers. Thanks to the volunteers, a composting bin is available for community garden use.

Garden plots are available to rent in the Recreation office. Renters may plant as early as they would like. Through Memorial Day there is a rental limit of one plot, and after that date renters may sign up for an additional plot. Lot renters have the ability to keep their plot from year to year if they sign up for it in January.

- Memorial Day:** Current renters may sign up for additional plots if available. Munson Park is open 7 am until 10 pm, 7 days a week!
