



Weekly Road Watch Report

Department of Engineering and Public Services

June 15-21, 2026

Below please find information on construction projects and other significant known activities within the City of Monroe for the upcoming week with traffic impacts. Projects #1 through #2 are carry-overs from last week, with #3 being NEW THIS WEEK and an MDOT project. 1. OMNI-FIBER CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Omni-Fiber and their prime subcontractor, Davey Resource Group, is installing new fiber internet lines to serve the majority of the City. While the majority of work will be aerial cable, approximately 20% of their installation will be underground conduit installation, which will occasionally require spot lane closures on various roadways. For the coming week, they will be working on underground boring in the neighborhood between CSX Railroad and Lavender Street, north of Elm Avenue, and Virginia Drive, with aerial cable installation occurring in numerous locations throughout the City.

2. SURF INTERNET CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Surf Internet is installing new fiber internet lines to serve portions of the City north of the River Raisin, mostly between Godfroy and Baptiste. All of their work will be underground, and they have started work from Lorain Street north, mostly between Godfroy and Hollywood. They will likely be working for the entirety of the summer, with spot lane closures only for the most part.

3. TELEGRAPH ROAD RESURFACING - SOUTH OF SEVENTH TO STEWART - MDOT PROJECT

Cadillac Asphalt is performing milling and paving operations for the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) on US-24 (Telegraph Road) from south of Seventh to Stewart Road. This work will involve lane closures during work activities, which also include filling in some gaps with new sidewalk where none exists. Work is scheduled to begin with pavement milling (removal) on the northbound lanes the week of June 15, and placement of new pavement is not expected until sometime in July. The City is mostly completed with its water main replacement on a short section of the southbound lanes between Seventh and Toledo, though some minor cleanup and pavement base work will occur in this area for the coming week.
